Dear Representatives Khanna and Massie,

We write in strong support of your bipartisan Epstein Files Transparency Act, which seeks to require the release of all unclassified government records related to Jeffrey Epstein and Ghislaine Maxwell. This is necessary to create justice and healing for the child and adult survivors of Jeffrey Epstein's systematic and extensive sexual abuse.

This bill aligns powerfully with recent legal reforms seeking to eliminate barriers for survivors of child sexual assault - such as those who suffered at the hands of Epstein and his network of abusers. In 2022, President Biden signed into law the Eliminating Limits to Justice for Child Sex Abuse Victims Act, lifting the federal statute of limitations for such cases. In 2023, California followed suit, passing landmark legislation to eliminate time limits for civil actions involving child sexual assault. These historic changes reflect a growing recognition across the nation: justice must not be constrained by deadlines that fail to account for the realities of trauma, delayed disclosure, and the courage it takes for survivors to come forward.

In 2025, this bill continues the growing and necessary movement of justice for survivors, putting their voices front and center and giving them a seat at the table. It reaffirms what survivors and advocates have long known, that the law must center survivors and prioritize transparency and accountability for abusers and the people and institutions that enabled them. We cannot allow powerful people or organizations to exploit legal technicalities to shield child sex assault perpetrators. Survivors deserve a chance for justice whenever they are ready, and we must be there for them when they are.

As legislators in California who have authored and championed survivor-centered laws, we know firsthand the transformative impact of creating transparency and removing barriers. The Epstein Survivors finally have a chance to tell their stories, giving us a full picture of the unimaginable trauma they have endured. With this knowledge, we must hold every perpetrator accountable and help the survivors begin to heal.

Thank you for your tireless leadership in working to ensure justice for survivors of Epstein's cruel and heinous network of abusers. True justice should rise above politics, partisanship, and power. We are grateful for your efforts and urge Congress to advance this bill swiftly.


